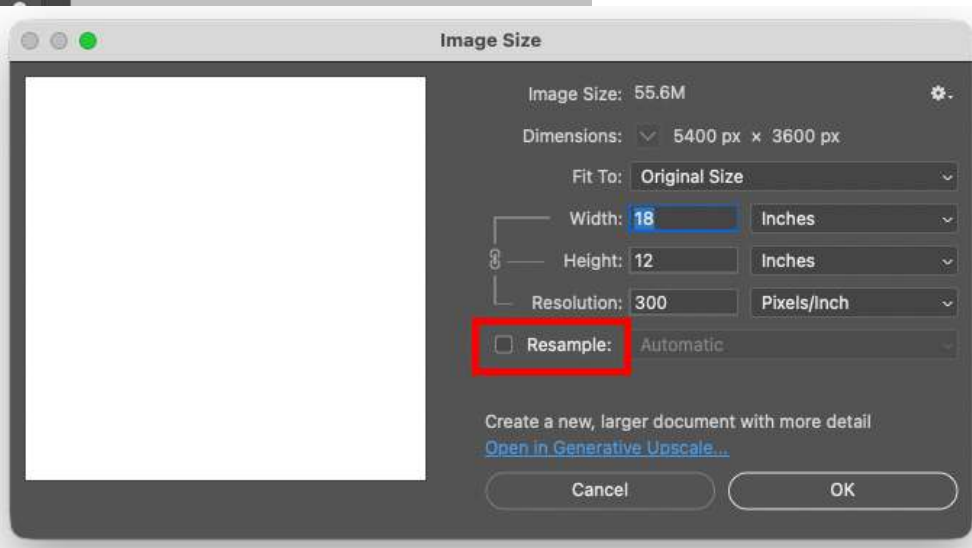
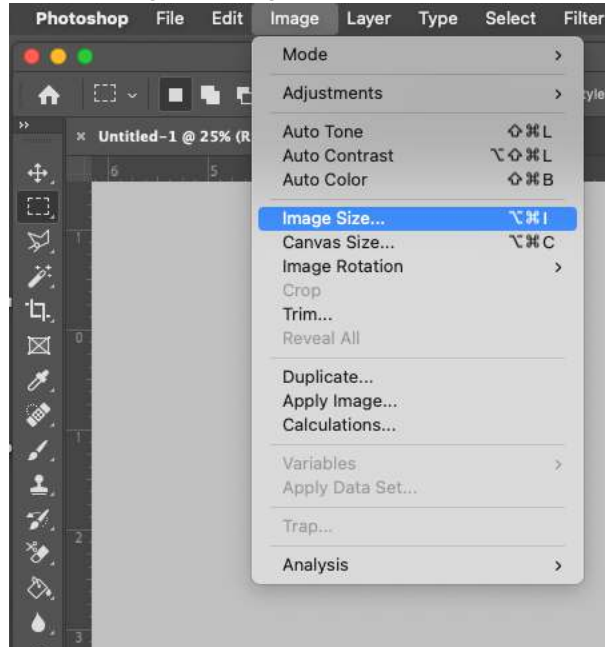


Sizing Images in Photoshop

Size your image.

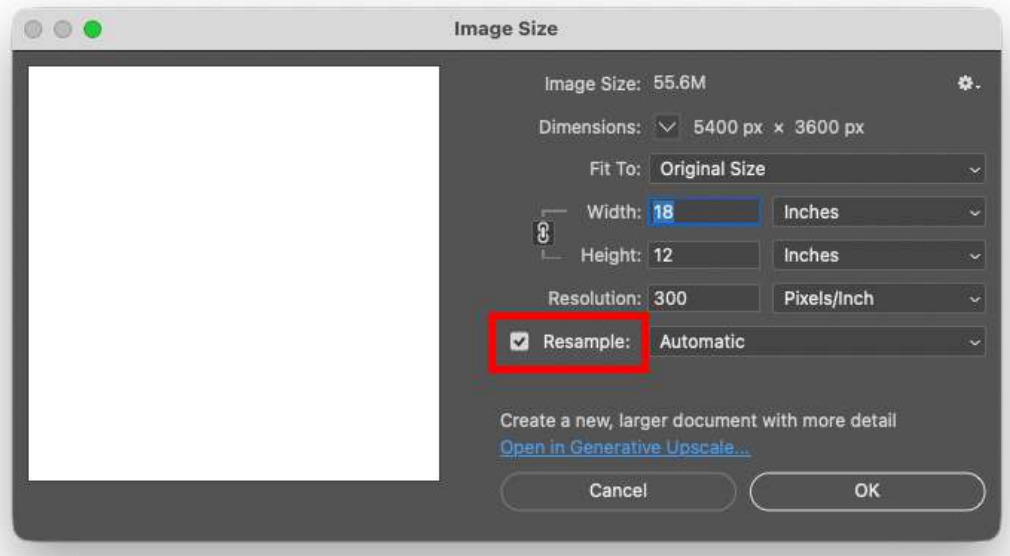
Go to Image > Image Size...



If Resample is unchecked, the rest of the image is linked.

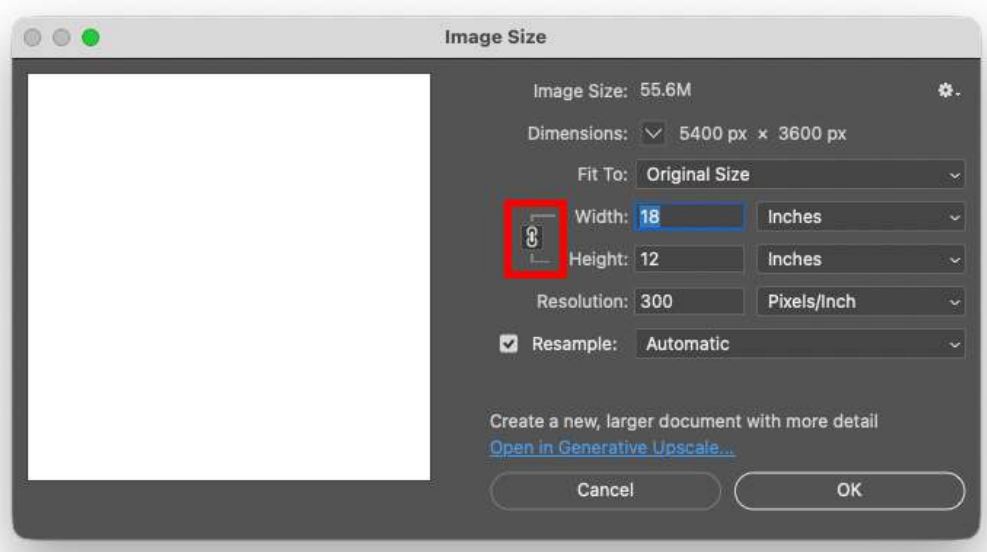
Meaning the numbers move around, but the file isn't changed.





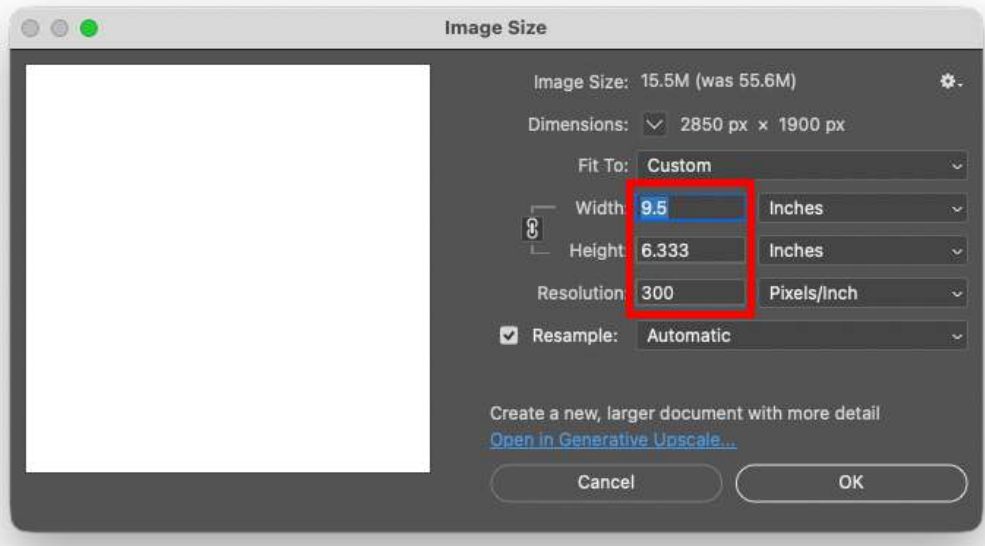
If Resample is checked.

Photoshop will either create or delete data depending if you are enlarging or reducing the image size.



Make sure the link is selected.

If it is unselected, then your image will be stretched or squished. Which you don't want.



For the width and height, since they are linked, you will only need to change one of the numbers.

If your class requires printing on an 8.5x11 sheet, the printable area for a sheet is 8.26x9.88". Meaning you don't size the image to 11". Instead, you size the long side to 9.5". The other size will stay proportional, usually around 6.33", but that depends on camera sensor size and cropping.

The **Resolution** must be at **300**, which is print resolution, 72 is a screen resolution and is too small for printing.
